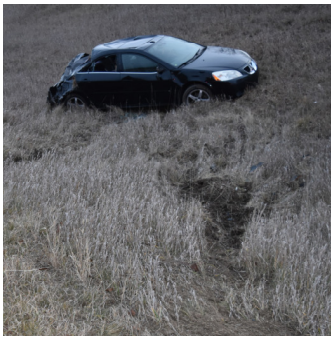
Public Safety Committee Chair, Steve Musselman, as well as the Board-appointed representative, David Seeger, will both be available for discussion.

01/10/2021@3:31 PM, Officer Bernat responded to a call regarding a stolen snowmobile and trailer. The caller stated that he recently reported his snowmobile stolen from a relative's house in Lansing, and had since found it for sale on Facebook. The caller set up a meet with the sellers, and asked police to intervene. Officer Bernat along with Officer Rochford, and multiple other agencies intercepted the suspects and took them in to custody. The three suspects were found to be from Florida. All were interviewed, and gave conflicting stories about why they were in Michigan, how they became in possession of the stolen snowmobile and trailer, and where they were going with it. The registered owner was able to positively identify the vehicles at the scene. One suspect admitted that there was a handgun in the vehicle, which turned out to be unregistered. The suspects are facing Felony Weapons, and Receiving and Concealing Stolen Motor Vehicle charges.

01/11/2021@11:35 AM, Det. Schaberg was dispatched for a harassment call. The caller stated that his roommate's ex-boyfriend had been stalking her. The suspect threatened to burn down their house, made it known he had a gun, and also stated he was willing to die by "suicide by cop". While the Detective was there, the suspect sent another message saying that he knew the police were there. Chief Gute was given a description of the suspect's vehicle and was able to locate it nearby. He attempted to stop the vehicle, and the driver fled the scene. Chief Gute was able to catch up to the vehicle at a dead end, and the driver fled on foot. A passenger in the vehicle was secured. Det. Schaberg arrived on scene and assisted in locating the driver. The suspect was taken to Sparrow due to injuries sustained in the pursuit. Charges are pending.

01/18/21@1:50 AM, Officer Rennaker observed a vehicle and fresh tire tracks in the parking lot of a closed local business. The vehicle was registered to a different local business. There were footprints leading away from the vehicle, and the officer located a male that was known to have an outstanding warrant. The suspect was placed into custody for his warrant, and questioned why he was in the parking lot. He gave several stories that did not match up. The officer made contact with the registered owner of the vehicle and asked to view their business's security footage. A male matching the description of the suspect was seen driving the vehicle away from the business. The suspect is facing UDAA and Larceny charges.

01/25/21@9:54 PM, Sgt. Christensen was en route to assist a Michigan State Trooper with a traffic stop, when he was notified that the suspect vehicle had just hit the Trooper and fled the scene. Sgt. Christensen was able to locate the vehicle and attempted to stop it. The suspect continued to flee, until eventually a tire fell off and the vehicle began to slow. The suspect fled on foot while the vehicle was still moving. Sgt. Christensen was able to apprehend the suspect, and question him. The suspect stated that he had fled because he had a warrant and did not want to be locked up again. The suspect's vehicle was searched and a stolen license plate, along with a suspected stolen catalytic converter were located.

02/06/2021@1:07 PM, Officer Bernat responded to a complaint at a local gas station. The owner of the business stated that she observed a female concealing items in her coat, and attempted to stop her from leaving the store. A physical altercation ensued, and a male that had come in with the suspect also became involved. The suspects eventually fled the store with the merchandise and left in their vehicle. The owner was left shaken, and with several abrasions. The suspect vehicle and suspects were identified through witnesses and video footage, and a search of the area was conducted. The suspects were located and interviewed. The male admitted that he was at the store and that he knew the female was stealing items. The female suspect would not admit to any wrongdoing. Both suspects have been charged with Felony Unarmed Robbery.

02/13/2021 @3:07 PM, Lt. Jones was dispatched to Meijer for an active retail fraud. A female was observed by store security leaving the store with kitchen appliances without paying for them and loading them into a waiting vehicle. The car left Meijer, and was located by the officer near the Taco Bell parking lot. The stolen items were located in the back seat of the vehicle. The passenger was identified as the suspect that stole the items, and was taken into custody. A second male subject that had arrived at Meijer with the suspect was located walking away from Meijer. The suspect admitted that all three subjects, including the driver, are addicted to Cocaine and steal to get money to pay for drugs. All three suspects had multiple outstanding warrants. , including retail fraud. The female suspect was lodged at Clinton County Jail and has been charged with Felony First Degree Retail Fraud.

02/26/2021 @ 2:38 PM, Det. Schaberg was dispatched to Meijer for a possible stolen vehicle complaint. A customer was unable to locate their vehicle when leaving the store. Store video surveillance captured a suspect leave the store, and drive away in the complainant's vehicle, which was left unlocked with the keys in the console. The vehicle was entered into law enforcement databases as stolen. On 02/27/2021 @ 0314 AM, Lansing Police Department notified Clinton County Central Dispatch that the vehicle had been located, and they had the driver in custody. Officer Rennaker responded to the scene, and the driver was visually identified as the suspect that was seen driving the vehicle away from Meijer. The suspect admitted to being at Meijer, but denied stealing the vehicle. The suspect has been charged with Felony Unlawful Driving Away of a Motor Vehicle.
