



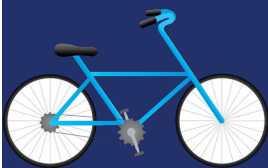

**BICYCLE SAFETY**



Bicyclists should:

- Ride with traffic
- Obey traffic signals, signs, and markings
- Ride no more than two abreast
- Wear a helmet and highly visible clothing
- Use a white headlight and red rear reflector (required between sunset and sunrise)

Motorists should:

- Give at least 3-foot clearance when passing bicyclists
- Yield to bicyclists as you would other vehicles
- Avoid distractions
- Do not park in marked bicycle lanes

06/03/2021@ 6:20 PM, Officer Bernat was dispatched to a two car PDA. The caller was in a van with her three young children. She stated that she was in the passing lane when the second involved vehicle drove in to the rear of her vehicle. Upon contact with the male driver of the second vehicle, a strong odor of intoxicants was present, and he was unsteady with slurred speech. The driver stated he was on his way home, but was unaware of his location. He admitted to drinking six beers before driving. He failed several sobriety tests, and registered a 0.16% PBT. The driver was detained and has been charged with OWI 1<sup>st</sup>.

06/04/2021@ 12:17 PM Officer Rochford and Det. Schaberg arrived at a local motel in reference to a stolen vehicle. LPD officers stated that the vehicle stolen from their jurisdiction was digitally tracked to that location. The vehicle was located behind the motel along with the two suspects in the theft. Officer Rochford detained the suspects while the vehicle was verified as stolen. The male suspect denied having any weapons, but a stun gun was found on his person. He also stated that he swallowed heroin when approached by police. The female suspect admitted to having needles in her purse, and was found with a large amount of blank checks belonging to someone else. The vehicle contained more drug paraphernalia, blank checks, and a large amount of clothing with tags. The male suspect was found to have ten outstanding warrants from surrounding jurisdictions, and was on probation with two different counties. The female had two warrants, including one for shoplifting. Both are facing charges for Receiving and Concealing a Stolen Motor Vehicle.

06/13/2021@8:12 AM, Officer Shellberg and Officer Bernat responded to a domestic assault involving a baseball bat. A male and female were located by the front door of the home, and an additional female was located in the driveway. The male stated that his wife verbally assaulted the other female and then became combative when his girlfriend approached the house. The wife admits to hitting her husband with a nearby baseball bat, and also destroying items in the home with the bat. The suspect claimed to not remember hitting the other female. Both the male and female sustained injuries. The suspect was transported to the Clinton County Jail, and has been charged with two counts of Felonious Assault, and Domestic Violence.
