Narratives of Major Incidents

October 4th at 1039 hours, DeWitt Township Fire was dispatched to US-127 South near State Road on a reported motor vehicle rollover crash. DeWitt Township Fire responded with three apparatus and four personnel. Mercy Ambulance also responded to the scene. The driver was transported to the hospital. DeWitt Township Fire also provided traffic control and assisted with cleanup. All units cleared the scene at 1127 hours.

October 4th at 1549 hours, DeWitt Township Fire was dispatched to a Motor Vehicle Crash (MVC) with injuries on Turner Road, south of Herbison Road. The crash involved a motorcycle. DeWitt Township Fire responded with three apparatus and six personnel. Mercy Ambulance also responded to the scene. The motorcycle driver was transported to the hospital. The other vehicle's driver and passenger were uninjured.

October 7th at 1147 hours, DeWitt Township Fire was dispatched to the 16000 block of Wood Road on a report of a car/bicyclist crash. DeWitt Township Fire responded with one apparatus and two personnel. Mercy Ambulance also responded to the scene. The bicyclist was transported to the hospital.

October 8th at 2033 hours, DeWitt Township Fire and Auto Aid Departments were dispatched to a structure fire in the Four Seasons Apartment Complex. The tenant called 911 and reported a bedroom on fire. DeWitt Township Fire responded with two apparatus and eight personnel. DeWitt Township Fire arrived on scene at 2043 hours. Auto Aid Departments of Delta Township, DeWitt Area, and Bath Township assisted. The tenant had knocked down the fire with a fire extinguisher. Fire personnel entered the apartment and completed the overhaul of the bedroom. The tenant was transported to the hospital for smoke inhalation. The fire was caused by a child using a lighter.

October 14th at 1632 hours, DeWitt Township Fire was dispatched to S. Bus 127 and Hickory Street on a reported Motor Vehicle Crash (MVC). One vehicle had crashed into a telephone pole. DeWitt Township Fire responded with two apparatus and four personnel.

Mercy Ambulance also responded to the scene. Two vehicles were involved in the crash. One vehicle had been pushed head on into the utility pole. Mercy Ambulance obtained four medical refusals.

October 15th at 2046 hours, DeWitt Township Fire was dispatched to a power line down in the 1000 block of E. Wieland Road. DeWitt Township Fire personnel arrived at the fire station where a vehicle had driven into the utility pole by the fire station. Consumers Energy was contacted for the live power line.

October 17th at 0300 hours, DeWitt Township Fire was requested for a cardiac arrest in the 10000 block of S. Lowell Road. Rescue 55 responded from Airport Road and was on scene at 0306 hours. The LUCAS chest compression device was used on the patient. The patient was transported to the hospital with a pulse. As of October 27th, the patient is in stable condition and is recovering.

October 24th at 0913 hours, DeWitt Township Fire was dispatched to S. Bus 127 and State Road on a Motor Vehicle Crash (MVC) involving four vehicles. DeWitt Township Fire responded with two apparatus and four personnel. Mercy Ambulance also responded to the scene. One patient was transported to the hospital.

October 24th at 1843 hours, DeWitt Township Fire responded to Airport Road over the Looking Glass River on a power line down and a tree on fire. DeWitt Township Fire responded with two apparatus and four personnel. Airport Road was blocked off on both ends of the bridge as the burning tree and power lines were blocking the roadway. Consumers Energy was contacted. DeWitt Township Fire was able to clear the scene at 2220 hours.

October 25th at 1400 hours, Chief DeKorte was requested to assist the Clinton County Sheriff's Department with a vehicle fire in the 9500 block of Kinley Road. A fire investigation was conducted with Fire Investigators from Ovid and Elsie Fire Departments.

October 27th at 2208 hours, DeWitt Township Fire and Auto Aid Departments were dispatched to a structure fire in the Four Seasons Apartment Complex. DeWitt Township Fire responded with three apparatus and twelve personnel. The fire was contained to the oven. The tenant did sustain a burn injury. The patient refused transport to the hospital. DeWitt Township Fire ventilated the apartment of smoke. The tenant was also advised to re-install two smoke detectors that were missing from the ceiling.
