WE NEED YOUR HELP

Many of you joined us last June at our "Visioning" Town Meetings to share your ideas about the future development of the Township. We have been meeting over the past several months to incorporate those ideas into an updated Comprehensive Development Plan. A draft of the updated Plan is expected to be available in late April, and we need your help again.

The Township will be holding a Town Meeting on **Thursday, May 19th at 7:00 p.m.** in the **Township Hall** located at 1401 W. Herbison Road. The purpose of the Town Meeting is to present the draft of the updated Comprehensive Development Plan and gather input from residents, land owners, business owners, and anyone else interested in creating a better community.

The draft Plan will include a new Future Land Use Map. The map is intended to provide for an appropriate balance and mix of uses in the Township. For example, it illustrates those areas that will be preserved for agricultural use, where new commercial and residential development is expected to occur, and the areas where the Capital City Airport is planning future expansions. The map is accompanied by a series of policies that will assure that development will occur in appropriate locations and be adequately served by utilities and roads.

The Plan will also include a list of actions that the Township expects to undertake over the next several years. These include conserving existing neighborhoods and encouraging new development along the Business-27 corridor in the southern portion of the Township; making necessary amendments to the Zoning Ordinance, including expanding access management regulations along the Business-27 corridor to assure the safe movement of vehicles; and planning for future new commercial development along the northern part of the Business-27 corridor.

Once the Township has had an opportunity to gather input on the draft Plan, we will incorporate any necessary changes and hold a public hearing before the Plan is adopted. We expect that the public hearing will be held in early August. The date will be provided in the next newsletter and on the Township's website at www.dewitttownship.org as we get closer to August. Once the draft Plan is available, it will also be posted on the website. If you have any questions or would like additional information about the Plan, please call the Planning Department at 669-6576.

We look forward to seeing you at the Town Meeting on May 19th at 7:00 p.m.

BURNING PERMIT INFORMATION

If you are planning to do any open burning in DeWitt Township, please familiarize yourself with Open Burning Ordinance 45.9. This Ordinance is detailed on your Burning Permit. You don't have a Burning Permit? We will be happy to provide you with this required Permit, which can be obtained at no cost from the DeWitt Township Fire Department or the Clerk's Office at the DeWitt Township Hall.

In part, the Burning Permit allows the open burning of brush, twigs/branches, leaves, and garden and yard debris. **Burning of any other materials is prohibited.** The Permit also allows the burning of recreational fires in a ground pit made of non-flammable materials. The Ordinance does not regulate recreational fires in portable fire pits.

The Burning Permit also describes the time of the year that open burning is allowed in your neighborhood and the weather conditions under which a safe burn can be conducted. It is important to familiarize yourself with these, as well as the other regulations described within the Burning Permit.

Over the last several years, the Fire Department has seen a steady decline in open burning violations, which results in a much safer community. If you have any questions about burning within DeWitt Township, contact the Fire Department at 669-0071.

SPRINGTIME IN THE CEMETERIES

Hurd and Gunnisonville cemeteries are busy places in the Spring since planting flowers and sprucing up is an annual tradition for many families. Our cemetery staff is rightfully proud of the high standard to which our cemeteries are maintained, but staff also recognizes the role that families play in the beautiful appearance of our cemeteries. Following a few simple rules is important, and the following rules warrant mentioning:

- 1) driving off the established roadways is prohibited
- 2) all trash, dead flowers, etc., are to be disposed of in the containers provided
- 3) no artificial ground ornamentation is allowed between March 15th and November 15th
- 4) planting of trees or shrubbery requires pre-approval by the Township
- 5) placement of any of the following is prohibited: woodchips or decorative stone; any type of edging; shepherd's hooks, fences and benches; thorned plantings; glass, plastic or clay containers
- 6) flowers may be planted in urns or in the ground within 12 inches of a monument or marker, but never outside the boundaries of the owner's burial space
- 7) the Township reserves the right to remove and dispose of, without notice, any unsightly, deteriorated, neglected, or prohibited item. Anyone who plans to do planting in the cemetery should contact the Clerk's Office to request a complete copy of the Cemetery Rules and Regulations or go online to www.dewitttownship.org.

CEMETERY FOUNDATIONS

Foundations are required to be installed, by Township staff, under all markers (headstones) placed in our cemeteries. These installations are typically done twice each year, once in the spring and once in the fall. The deadline for ordering foundation placement for this spring's installation is May 1st. Arrangements for installation of a foundation are made by contacting the Clerk's Office.

ELECTION DAY – MAY 3, 2005

May 3rd is Election Day in DeWitt Township. With legislative changes effective January 1, 2005, the Township Clerk will be running all future elections within the Township. Schools will no longer be running any elections. Bath schools, DeWitt schools, East Lansing schools and Lansing Community College have selected the May 3rd date to take their issues to the voters. Although Lansing schools has chosen the November election date to coincide with the City of Lansing elections, Lansing school district voters within DeWitt Township will be voting on Lansing Community College issues at the May election.

NEW VOTER IDENTIFICATION CARDS showing new school election polling locations are being mailed. If you have not received a new voter identification card yet, you will be receiving one prior to Election Day. Please discard your old card when your new one arrives. In DeWitt Township, your School District Polling Location will now be the same as your Polling Location for governmental elections. Hence, there will be no further confusion as to where you go to vote because you will now vote at the same location for all elections. Your new voter card will show whether you vote at Herbison Woods School, the Township Herbison Road Fire Station, or the Township Community Center. As always, polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS are available at the Clerk's Office. If you are sixty years of age or older, or expect to be absent from the community, or will be working in the polls on Election Day, you qualify to vote by absentee ballot. You can make arrangements to get an Absentee Ballot by calling or visiting the Clerk's Office.

The Township maintains a list of voters who have requested to automatically receive an Absentee Ballot Application prior to each election. If you are on this list, you should have already received an Absentee Ballot Application for the May 3rd Election. If you believe you have requested to be on the list, but have not yet received an application, please call the Clerk's Office.

IF YOU PLAN TO VOTE IN THE POLLS, it is often useful to view the ballot before Election Day. Sample ballots are available from the Clerk's Office.

HOME SECURITY

There are some simple steps that you can take to keep your home secure from theft. Begin by walking around your house and pretending you're a burglar. Case your own house and ask yourself how you'd get in. Burglars will try and find an easy entry into homes.

The following checklist is provided to better secure your home from burglars:

- Keep shrubbery trimmed. Thick, tall shrubbery provides cover for a burglar.
- If you have a dog or alarm system, put up signs that say you do. They deter burglars.
- Never leave a house key in an obvious place, such as the mailbox, under a doormat, over a door ledge.
- Make sure the exterior of your home is well lit, especially near doors and areas away from neighbors.
- Close and lock your windows. Glass breaking attracts attention, so most burglars don't like to break glass.
- Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- Use a steel rod or wooden dowel to secure sliding doors and make sure locks are in working order.
- Install an alarm system.
- Have a wide angle door viewer (peephole) installed. Know who is at your door before you open it.

Fees will be charged for the disposal of some materials.

PROPERTY TAX INFORMATION

Winter property tax bills were due February 14, 2005. Delinquent property taxes were turned over to the County Treasurer on March 1, 2005. All delinquent real property taxes must now be paid through the County Treasurer's Office. There will be additional interest and penalties. To obtain your payoff amount, contact the County Treasurer's Office at (989) 224-5280.

Summer tax bills will be mailed out the first week of July. They are due September 14, 2005. If you have an escrow account, your tax bill will be mailed directly to the Mortgage Service Company that has requested your bill. All other tax bills will be mailed directly to homeowners. If you do not get a tax bill and believe you should have, call the Treasurer's Office at 668-1411.

For qualified residents, you may defer your summer tax bill until February 14, 2006, without penalty. For an application to defer, contact the Treasurer's Office. To qualify your household income must be less than \$25,000 for the prior calendar year, AND one of the following:

- Senior Citizen (62 years or older)
- Paraplegic, Quadriplegic
- Eligible serviceman, veteran, widow/widower
- Blind Person
- Totally and permanently disabled

TREATED WOOD: NOW MORE CORROSIVE TO HARDWARE

Spring – time to start thinking about that deck project. Effective January 1, 2004 the wood preservative industry voluntarily stopped using Chromated Copper Arsenate or (CCA) to pressure treat wood for use in conditions of exposure to water or moisture such as residential patio decks. The alternative chemical used by the wood preservative industry to treat wood, called Alkaline Copper Quat or (ACQ), is three to four times more corrosive to hardware and fasteners. In short, with the new wood preservatives, the homeowner must be careful to use more corrosive resistant hardware and fasteners or they will fail.

What you need to make sure of, whether you are doing the project yourself or contracting it out, is that the hardware and fasteners are rated at what the industry recognizes as the minimum required, which is a G180 designation. This designation indicates the thickness of the galvanized coating on that hardware or fastener. Triple coating is not necessarily better than a double coating or double dipped product because one company's normal standard may be a G60 which when triple-dipped is still only a G180 rating while another company's norm is G90 which when doubled-dipped is the same.

In other words, pay attention to the rating and make sure the product is not designated less than the minimum G180 which is required for use with ACQ pressure treated wood products.

Stainless hardware and fasteners are the most corrosive resistant, but will cost more. Finally, it is extremely important to match fasteners and hardware. If you use a hanger that is double-dipped and has a G180 -185 rating then use nails that are also galvanized and have the same rating. Similarly when stainless hardware is used, stainless nails and/or screws should be used.

Remember to get your building permit before starting your deck project. Done properly, your deck should provide many years of enjoyment!

Youth T-ball and Pee Wee Baseball

This summer's youth baseball program has been restructured to allow families more time together during the summer months. T-ball will be offered to those ages 4-5 and Pee Wee will be offered to 5-7 year olds (5 year olds must have previously played 1 year of t-ball in our t-ball league). T-ball games will be played on Mondays and Wednesdays with no weekly practices. Pee Wee games will be played on Tuesdays and Thursdays with no weekly practices. Game locations will be split between the DeWitt Sports Park and Valley Farms Park. Practices begin on May 31st with games beginning the week of June 13th. Games will run for 4 weeks ending on July 14th (no games the week of July 4th). Registrations will be accepted April 29th - May 20th with late registrations accepted through May 27th. Game equipment, with the exception of a glove, will be provided.

Adult Softball Leagues

Our spring/summer adult softball leagues will be offered for both Coed and Men's teams. Coed league teams will play 12 games on Wednesday evenings beginning on May 11th and will end with a league tournament on July 20th and July 21st. Men's league teams will play 12 games beginning on May 12th and will end with a league tournament on July 19th and July 21st. All games will be played at the DeWitt Sports Park and Valley Farms Park. The team fee of \$260 includes all game balls, team score book, line up cards and awards for both the league champion and runner up and the tournament champion and runner up. Both leagues follow ASA rules and will use ASA certified umpires. Registration for adult softball leagues begins on April 1st. Register your team early as space is limited and the leagues do fill up quickly.

Frederik Meijer Gardens and Sculpture Park Bus Trip

This bus trip will be a great addition to your summer whether you are a senior citizen looking to appreciate the natural beauty of the gardens or if you have a child at home on summer break looking to do something fun with his/her parent. The Dean Trailways bus will leave the DTCC on Thursday, June 16th at 8:15 a.m. and will return to the DTCC at 4:30 p.m. The bus trip is open to all ages, but those under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. SEWER BACKUP? WHO ARE YOU GOING TO CALL?

When you have a sewer backup in your house or business, it is important to remember to call the Southern Clinton County Municipal Utilities Authority (SCCMUA) immediately, day or night. SCCMUA is responsible for maintaining the sanitary sewer lines in the Township. In the event of a backup, they will come out free of charge and make sure the blockage is not in the sewer main in the road. If it is, SCCMUA will take care of the blockage. If not, the property owner will likely need a plumber because the blockage is in their pipes. SCCMUA can be reached Monday - Friday at 669-8311 or evenings, weekends, and holidays by calling Clinton County Central Dispatch at 9-1-1.

Just a reminder, when you renew your vehicle license tabs, please check your registration to make sure your county is listed as both "CLINTON" and coded as "19." This will assure that your tax dollars are spent to maintain local roads. The County Road Commission has informed us that a problem exists in the southern portion of the County and registrations are being coded incorrectly. Contact the Secretary of State office if your registration is coded incorrectly.
